Talking Points: National Preparedness Month

- September is National Preparedness Month! Take the time to ensure your family and

home are ready for any emergency that may come your way.

- Why prepare now for emergencies? Emergency workers will help after a disaster strikes, but they may not be able to reach everyone right away. That's why it's so important to be ready to survive on your own for at least three days during an emergency. - Do you have an emergency kit? Make sure you have enough supplies to last at least 72 hours. Build your emergency kit by starting here: <https://www.ready.pa.gov/BePrepared/BuildKit/Pages/For-Your-Home.aspx>
- Being prepared can be the difference between life and death during an emergency. Take the time to make a plan with your family today. <https://www.ready.pa.gov/BePrepared/MakeaPlan/Pages/default.aspx>
- Don't forget about your pets during an emergency. Make sure you have a plan in place for them as well. Get started here: <https://www.ready.pa.gov/BePrepared/PlanSpecialNeeds/Pages/Pets-and-Livestock.aspx>
- Take the time to learn basic first-aid skills and CPR. You never know when you may need to use them. Check your local hospital or Red Cross chapter for offerings in your area.
- Being prepared doesn't have to be expensive. Start small by making a list of the essentials you need and go from there. Pick up one or two items every time you go to the store.
- Your emergency contact list will help you keep in contact with your family in case you are separated during a disaster. Complete an [emergency contact card](#) (PDF) for each member of your family. Keep the completed cards in a prominent location in your home as well as wallets, purses, etc.

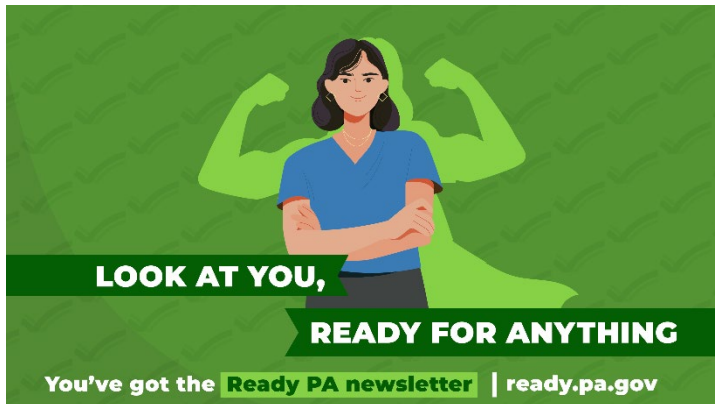
